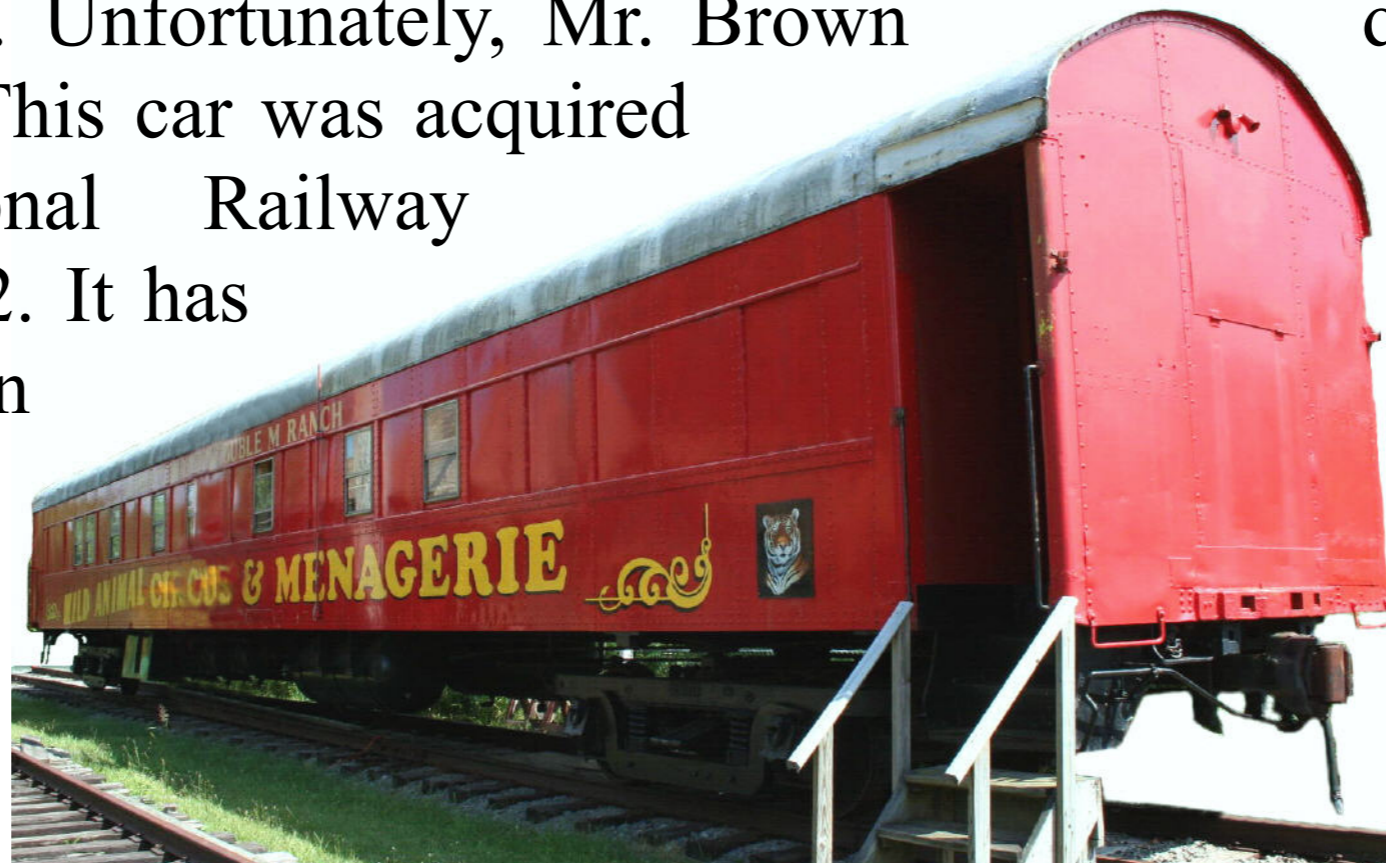


CIRCUS CAR

This car started life as a Boston & Albany (New York Central) commuter coach. It was purchased along with several others by Arthur T. Brown of nearby Mallory. It was Mr. Brown's plan to create a circus train. His cars were painted and partially restored, and parked on a siding north of here in Parish. He had hoped to take the train and circus animals he owned around New York State. Unfortunately, Mr. Brown died before he could implement his dream. This car was acquired by the Central New York Chapter, National Railway Historical Society, and placed here in July 2002. It has been restored as a memory of Art Brown. Many displays inside were donated by the Hoxie Tucker Ring, a circus modelers group. There is also a theater inside presenting circus videos.
