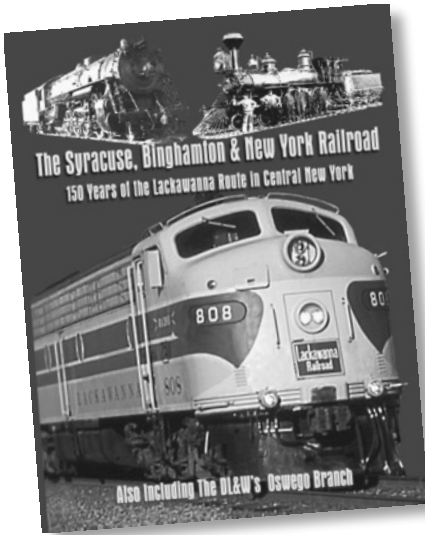


# The SYRACUSE, BINGHAMTON & NEW YORK RAILROAD

Photo, page 7: The crowd is gathered on **South Clinton Street** where it intersected with DL&W tracks entering the depot area off Armory Circle (West Jefferson St.). [Our text misidentified this as West Onondaga Street, which is actually a block away.]

Photos, page 22: The date of the tragic accident at the downtown Syracuse station was **December 19, 1956** [not August 1957].

Upper caption, page 27: The coal train is heading toward **Solvay**. [A computer glitch changed *Solvay* to "*Slay*."]

Addendum – Bottom photo, page 18: The man kneeling on the roof of the station canopy was a workman finishing the roof. If you look closely at the building's exterior in the opening day photo, you'll see that the station was still under construction even as the first train arrived!
